Dear Parents / Guardians,

Happy new year and welcome back to school. To our Sec 2 – 5 students, I hope you have spent the Nov-Dec holiday meaningfully. To our new Sec 1 students, a very warm welcome to Zhenghua Secondary School; it will be an exciting 4 – 5 year journey ahead as you discover new passions and areas of interests, expand your knowledge, make new friends, and develop yourselves holistically.

We ended 2018 on a high note with our very own school musical Tapestry – When New Meets Old. More than 170 of our performing arts students came together under the direction of our performing arts teachers to showcase their artistic talent through an aesthetic production blending both new and old art forms. The audience were enthralled by this self-produced and self-scripted musical. It was a fitting end to the year, and a great preview to the celebrations coming up in 2019.

Indeed, 2019 is going to be a very exciting year as we celebrate Zhenghua Secondary School's 20th anniversary. Our school started humbly in container classrooms in 2000, and moved to our current premises in 2002. This year, we welcome our 20th batch of Zhenghua Secondary students. Our school has come a long way, and we will celebrate our many achievements at our 20th Awards Day on 12 April through the launch of a heritage gallery comprising several commemorative walls showcasing the milestones in the school's 20-year journey and a brief history of our Bukit Panjang neighbourhood. The celebrations will culminate in the Zest Carnival and Night Arts Festival on Saturday 6 July. We'd like to invite all parents and alumni to come join in the festivities and games at this carnival in the day, and enjoy the aesthetic performances from our students in the evening. More details will be shared with you closer to the date of these events.

While we celebrate as a school, we will continue to work hard together towards our vision of "Every Student, a Principled and Future-Ready Leader". In line with MOE's efforts to move away from an overemphasis of academic grades, our school will put in even greater effort to make learning more engaging and authentic through the time freed up from doing away with mid-year examinations at Sec 1 and 3. ICT will continue to be utilised in teaching and learning, and teachers will increasingly harness technology to carry out formative assessments throughout the year to understand how well our students are progressing in their learning. Beyond the academics, teachers will continue to emphasise the importance of character and leadership development, while grounding them in our school values of respect, resilience, responsibility, integrity and compassion. We will also expand our efforts in Positive Education to develop resilient students grounded in sound values, who lead life with a deep sense of purpose, and are inspired to contribute to the greater good of society.

In the spirit of continuous improvement and in response to feedback from our students, there are some changes to our school rules and school curriculum timings. In addition to the polo t-shirt which can be worn from Tuesdays to Fridays, students will now be allowed to wear half-uniform (i.e. their PE t-shirt tops with school pants/skirt) after recess, and after PE lessons in view of the increasingly hot weather. We will also tighten our rules on the use of handphones in the classrooms. While we will not totally ban the use of personal electronic devices in school, we will however confiscate them when they are misused. We may have to call down parents/guardians to retrieve these confiscated devices if a student repeatedly

misuses such devices in school. We have also made adjustments to the ending time of formal school curriculum hours to allow our students more time to prepare for their CCAs. Please see the details of all the changes in the following pages.

Works for the Senja-KJE flyover have started and are slated to complete in end 2021. This link road cum flyover will eat into our school compound and the school management is working closely with LTA to minimise the noise and inconvenience caused to the school. We will also brief students on the added precaution they need to take while entering and exiting the school compound during this period of construction. We seek your understanding to bear with the construction during this time, and also the lack of visitor parking spaces in the event you need to visit us.

From 2019, we will also start to tap on technology to get in touch with parents and guardians. For all Sec 1s, the main mode of communication will be via the Parent Gateway app. For Sec 2 – 5s, we encourage parents too to download and login to this app to receive news and information from the school. Eventually in a few years, we hope to cease all forms of physical letters to parents with exception of a few which cannot be sent through the app.

Let me end this first letter of the year by encouraging all students to work hard, to work smart, to learn from your mistakes, and to live up to the school values. Make lots of friends, eat healthily, and take part in all school programmes and activities enthusiastically. Know that the school will put in every effort to support you and to prepare you well for the future. Parents and guardians, do continue providing the best guidance and care for your child and take the time to understand your child's likes and dislikes, fears and aspirations, and what goes on in his or her school life. Do reinforce their good behaviours and set clear boundaries. The teachers and all of the staff members in Zhenghua look forward to forging an even closer partnership with you as we work together to shape our students' character and to help them succeed well in life. The Form Teachers will also contact you from time to time to provide updates on your child's progress. Students who take SBB subjects in MTL and Science, Higher Mother-Tongue Languages, and Sec 3E/4E students taking an 8th subject will experience a longer timetable. The detailed timetable will be shared with your child/ward.

Students are to assemble in the parade square or their respective classrooms by 7.35 am every morning. Students who need to leave school before the official dismissal time each day are to obtain permission through our staff in the General Office. All CCAs and after school enrichment programmes should end by 6.30 pm. The school compound closes at 7 pm on weekdays.

2. Attendance

As absence from school without valid reasons will negatively impact your child's / ward's Conduct Grades and general performance, we seek your support in the following matters related to school attendance.

Absence from school as a result of illness must be supported by a valid medical certificate (MC). Absence due to other valid reasons e.g.: bereavement in the family, must be supported with a letter written by parents or legal guardian. This MC or letter is to be submitted promptly to the Form Teacher when the student returns to school. Students **have up to a week** to produce these documents for valid absence, failing which the absence will be deemed as truancy and appropriate consequences will be meted out.

3. Updated School Rules for 2019

Please note the updated school rules regarding use of personal electronic devices for 2019.

- I. Use of personal electronic devices like mobile phones/tablets/iPods/iPads are forbidden during and between lessons as well as during all formal school activities (e.g. tests, examinations, CCAs, Sports Day etc.).
- II. Students are expected to exercise personal responsibility for such devices that are brought to school. The school will not be liable or responsible for any damages or loss of such electronic devices, including loss due to theft.
- III. No charging of electronic devices is allowed at all times.
- IV. No video and voice recording is allowed at all times unless permission is granted.
- V. Non-conformance of the above conditions, constitutes a violation of the use of personal electronic devices policy and devices will be confiscated.
- VI. Parents may be called in to retrieve such confiscated electronic devices in the event of repeated violation of this policy.

ACADEMIC MATTERS

9. As announced during the MOE Work Plan Seminar 2018, there will be major changes in school-based assessments in 2019. There will be no mid-year exams for Sec 1 and 3 students. The details for subject Weighted Assessments and exams will be issued to your child / ward by **Term 1 Week 3**. All Weighted Assessments, class and common tests will be conducted during curriculum time unless otherwise stated. Please ensure that your child / ward maintains a regular study schedule.

10. The STAR (Stretch-Train-Affirm-Remediate) Programme for Sec 4 Express and 5 NA will commence in **Term 1 Week 2**. Please refer to the detailed STAR schedule that will be provided to your child at a later date.

CCA MATTERS

11. CCA, an important component in the holistic education of your child/ward, is a platform for the development of character, life skills and 21st century competencies. It is through CCA that they are able to discover and develop their interests and talents. CCA attendance is compulsory, and we seek your understanding that any absence from a training/practice session must be covered with a medical certificate. The schedules for CCA training and practice can be found on the CCA noticeboards in school. The list of CCA teachers-in-charge can be found in **Annex B**.

FINANCE AND ADMIN MATTERS

12. School Bill

It is mandatory for all schools to use the School Bill in 2019 for billing of all enrichment programmes and school charges. The School Bill charges will be deducted from the students' Edusave or Giro account (for Singapore

Citizens). Parents have the option to pay via AXS only if there is insufficient amount in Edusave and their Giro account is inactive. Students who are Permanent Residents or International Students are to pay in cash or by cheque at the General Office.

13. School Smart Cards (SSC)

Secondary One students will be issued with a new Secondary level School Smart Cards (SSC). The delivery of their SSC will be updated in due course. In the meantime, they can continue to use their Primary level SSCs for concessionary travel till end Apr 2019. Students can still purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their Primary level SSCs but they would need to purchase the BCP for Secondary School students.

14. Transit Link E-Transport Vouchers

Students whose FAS application has been approved for 2019 are to redeem their January 2019 Transport e-vouchers from 28 December 2018 to 10 January 2019. Secondary 1 FAS students will only be able to redeem their Transport e-vouchers in the following month.

SAFETY AND HEALTH-RELATED MATTERS

15. All students are to enter the school compound only through the **rear gate along Bukit Panjang Ring Road** before 7.35 am. The table shows the rear gate opening hours.

For enhanced security, students are to use the main gate to enter and exit the school compound after 4.00 pm. For students who travel to school by car, parents may drop off your child at the rear gate along **Bukit Panjang Ring Road**. Please refrain from making illegal U-turns as this would pose a danger to other pedestrians and vehicles. Parents are discouraged from turning into the school to drop your child off except during heavy downpours.

16. If your child intends to cycle to school, please note that he / she will need to submit a Parent’s Consent Form for cyclists to the General Office by **Term 1 Week 2**. All student cyclists need to comply with the regulations as stipulated by the Singapore Traffic Police on safe cycling attire and road traffic rules for cyclists. All students cycling to and from school will hence have to put on a helmet for their personal safety. For our students’ safety and the safety of pedestrians, students are not allowed to use personal mobility devices such as e-scooters to travel to and from school.

17. There will be a temperature-taking exercise on **Monday, 7 January 2019**. Sec 1 students will be provided with a new Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT). All other students are to ensure that they have a functioning ODT with them during the exercise.

18. We thank all parents for your continued support over the past years. Your partnership with the school and invaluable feedback has enabled us to improve school processes and programmes resulting in better outcomes for your child/ward.
